- I. You agree to indemnify us against any claims in respect of the above warranties and this indemnity shall survive the termination of this Agreement.
- III. You assert your Moral Right to be identified as the Author(s). We will respect your rights as the Author(s). That is, we will make sure that your name(s) is/are always clearly associated with the Article, and we will not make any substantial change to your Article without consulting you. When the Article is accepted, we undertake to publish it as soon as we reasonably can. On publication, we will send you a free digital copy.
